Councillor's Corner - March 2016 by Al Vinni



Given the weather of the last few weeks I have no idea what March is going to be like. It appears it's going to come in like a Lion if you can believe the short term weather forecast. We've certainly enjoyed a very mild winter and by the end of this month spring really will be in the air.

I would like to use this month's column to talk about a Notice of Motion that we are going to debate at our March 8 weekly Council meeting. The Notice of Motion concerns proposals to change the ward boundaries, the ward representation and the status of the elected Councillors.

As a Councillor's Notice of Motion, namely that of Councillor McGrath, there is no public engagement that occurs, nor is there any background information supplied by municipal administration. Councillors simply have the right to bring our own Notices of Motion as we see fit.

In this case, I disagree very strongly with Councillor McGrath bringing a motion on the topic of ward and Councillor changes in this manner. The subject matter should be, and I am sure it is, of concern to all citizens of the municipality and for it to be put on a Council agenda with only two-week's notice to everyone seems very disrespectful. To summarize the motion which can be read in its entirety on the municipal website, it proposes shifting the northern boundary of Ward 3, (which is the Saprae Creek and Draper Road ward), up north of Fort McKay. It then proposes to have the communities of Saprae Creek and Draper road moved into the urban Ward 1. This would leave Ward 3 essentially with only the population of Fort McKay, any eligible voters in the Tower Road campsite and the few people that live at the corner of Highway 63 and 881. Essentially Ward 3 would become a ward with approximately 100 people in it.

Further, Ward 4 would then encompass only Fort Chipewyan and would have only one representative, not the current two. Saprae Creek and Draper Road residents would be in the urban Ward 1 and vote for the six at-large urban Councillors. It is important to remember that these ideas are simply something that has come from the fertile imagination of Councillor McGrath and not from anywhere else. I think Councillor McGrath's proposal for the new geographic boundaries of the wards illustrates his ignorance of the rural communities, but I do appreciate that a few residents of Saprae Creek and Draper Road have expressed to me over the years they might prefer to vote in the urban ward.

The reason I do not think that that would be helpful is that the urban Councillors are almost always primarily from Thickwood and Timberlea, we have one Councillor this term who lives in the Lower Townsite. As such the urban Councillors are often unaware of rural issues and quite unengaged with rural residents. Every Councillor takes an oath to represent the entire region, and you are free to contact any of them if you're seeking assistance that you feel could be provided, but by and large the urban Councillors do not take an active role in rural issues or in assisting rural residents. They defer rural matters to the rural Councillors and to the credit of the urban Councillors; they often support the arguments and information put forward by rural Councillors regarding strictly rural issues. This region was not established based on the principle of representation by population, the governing structure was determined based on giving a significant voice to rural even though they represent a relatively small percentage of the population. You have to remember it's the rural that has the tax base; it's the rural where 90% of the municipality's taxes come from.



With only 4 of 11 Council members representing the rural areas it is perhaps not surprising that 20 years after amalgamation, after a written promise was made for the municipality to provide equal services to the rural and urban citizens, it is only now that Council is moving to provide sewer and water services to the rural communities comparable with those services provided to the urban residents. It has taken 20 years for that promise to be backed up by action; with even less rural representation it is likely to become even more difficult for the legitimate and important rural issues to get a fair hearing and a proper disposition from a Council moving towards being a Council only for Fort McMurray.

It strikes me as odd that Draper Road and Sapræe Creek would be moved into the urban ward because there's maybe only one thing that everybody in Sapræe and Draper can agree on and that is that we are living a rural lifestyle. When measured in distance, we are not a long way from the urban service area of Fort McMurray, but we are significantly different in our lifestyle in that we truly embrace the benefits and pleasures of living in a rural area. I will never support anything that will diminish in any way our rural status. I note that Draper Road and Sapræe Creek are not in the Urban Service Area, and further, that Sapræe Creek is not even in the Urban Development Sub-Region, and as such will likely never be formally in the Urban Service Area of this municipality.

I believe the governing structure of this region, now 20 years old, has served us very well and really does not need any significant changes to it. If I were to be asked what changes might be helpful I would say perhaps the urban area of Fort McMurray should be divided into six separate wards given that most urban Councillors historically reside in the Thickwood and Timberlea areas. Who represents Gregoire? Waterways? Abasand? Beaconhill? When no one from those areas is elected to Council. I will leave that issue to the urban Councillors to consider.

Concerning unequal pay for Councillors is a constitutional non-starter. That is a proposal that would be unprecedented in modern Western democracy. There are no definitions of politicians in this country concerning them being full-time versus part-time; that is a determination made by each elected person as to the time they want to devote to their position. It is legal for any elected politician in Canada to work at another job while they hold elected office, with the only exception being those elected representatives who are appointed to a provincial or federal cabinet post. A Cabinet Minister, as a member of the executive branch of government, cannot engage in other work due to conflict of interest concerns. Therefore, to those who feel they would like to see Councillors working 40 or 50 hours a week other than the 20 to 30 hours a week we work now, that can only be encouraged by a higher rate of pay for the position. However, regardless of the pay, it would still be the elected representative's prerogative to work as much as they saw fit. The people would decide to elect or not elect them in the next election, taking into account their perception of how hard the person worked for their money.

For any of what Councillor McGrath is proposing to actually happen requires support from at least half the rural Councillors and agreement from the Provincial Cabinet, with the Premier ultimately signing off on these two things. The chances of that happening are extremely unlikely to occur. However, it will be interesting to have the debate on March 8 to understand everybody's thoughts on the aspects of the municipality's governing structure that Councillor McGrath's motion has raised. Rural Water & Sewer Servicing (RWSS) – February Update

RWSS project aims to strengthen regional service delivery quality for the residents of Wood Buffalo. The project will see residents of Anzac, Conklin, Gregoire Lake Estates, Janvier Sapræ Creek and Draper receiving either new or upgraded water and sewer service. This update will help you stay informed about RWSS preparation in your community.

Sapræ Creek

On February 10, the Sapræ Creek AGM hosted experts from the RWSS project who presented an update on the progress in the community.

The results of the recent homeowner questionnaire are being reviewed by the RWSS team and used to develop detailed designs for individual lot connections.

Anzac & Gregoire Lake Estates

On February 24, residents of Anzac and Gregoire Lake Estates were invited to meet with experts from the RWSS project at the Rural Open House held at the Anzac Recreation Centre.

Property owners in Anzac and Gregoire Lake Estates will be receiving a mailed questionnaire in February, sent by the RMWB Engineering Department and its consultant, Urban Systems. The questionnaire is intended to get a detailed understanding of each property so that lot connections can be designed.

Conklin

Conklin residents attended the recent Rural Open House at the Conklin Community Hall (Nakewin Centre). Engineering and project management staff from the RWSS project presented an update and met with residents afterwards.

Janvier

On March 2, Janvier's residents have the opportunity to meet with the RWSS project team. The Janvier Rural Open House will be held at the Janvier Municipal Office from 6-8 p.m..

Draper

RMWB staff are communicating with the residents of Draper to determine the best way to update members of community.

CARELESS SMOKING



A large number of home fires in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo are caused by smoking materials. Within Canada, cigarettes are the number one cause of fire-related fatalities, and result in more property damage than fires started by other sources*. Fires related to cigarettes are due to negligence and are easily preventable. *Health Canada; www.hc-sc.gc.ca

1. Always ensure to fully extinguish your cigarettes in a deep, stable based ashtray.

- A)** Soak cigarette ashes and butts in water before throwing away. Always use outdoor garbage's to dispose of soaked ashes.
- B)** Never use a potted plant to extinguish your cigarettes. Potted plants contain fertilizers and organic substances that are extremely flammable.
- C)** Never throw cigarettes into household garbage cans as they typically contain combustible materials that can easily ignite and cause a home fire.

2. If you choose to smoke – smoke outside!

- A)** Never smoke in your home while drowsy, laying down, in bed, consuming alcohol or using medication which may affect alertness.
- B)** If smoking in the home, check cushions, chairs and sofas for cigarettes.
- C)** If smoking in the home, it is recommended that you install a smoke alarm in your bedroom to alert you of a fire if you fall asleep while smoking.

3. Keep children safe!

- A)** Keep all smoking materials, including lighters and matches, locked and out of reach from children.

**Wildfire
Hazard** **LOW**

As per Ministerial Order signed February 4, Alberta's wildfire season will start early again this year.

It officially begins March 1 and fire permits are required for any burning.

You can get a free permit by contacting your local Agriculture and Forestry office. Fire permits are required for all burning except campfires outside the Urban Service Area of Fort McMurray from March 1 to October 31.

Make Sure it's Out

Now is also the time to check your fall and winter burn sites. Prod with a metal pole and feel for heat to help determine if your fire is extinguished or if it's still burning underground. If you're out snowmobiling or ice fishing or winter camping, please remember to put your campfires out. Don't assume they will go out on their own because it's winter! That's not true - Mother Nature won't put your fire out - that's your job! Soak it, stir the ashes, and soak it again. Fires that dig into the ground now will be very hard to extinguish later in the spring.

We are looking forward to a safe wildfire season this year.


