Councillor's Corner - May 2016 by Al Vinni



I write this column while waiting to go to Boomtown Casino to work the late shift as part of the awesome group of volunteers from Sapræ Creek who are volunteering this Thursday and Friday night to make sure Sapræ Creek gets its share of casino money. The Sapræ Creek Residents Society uses this money wisely to support the activities and programming that many enjoy out here. Thanks to Marilyn Rustad for her relentless dedication to rounding up volunteers and keeping track of the money all year round.

Took a little foray onto Facebook today. Looks like they must have had a radar trap set up today on Sapræ Creek Trail, judging by the comments. Speed enforcement locations are published every month in various media and online, just sayin'... Anyway, you're preaching to the converted when you say the speed limit on Sapræ Creek Trail is too low. I have been working through the Land Planning and Transportation Committee to try to convince our traffic engineers to agree to raise that limit, at least to 80, so then we can do 89 without getting a ticket. (Little secret: It has been confirmed to me that they do not ticket for less than 10 over, unless you're stunting, or passing a police car, stuff like that.) As a four lane divided highway with street lights and not very much traffic, Sapræ Creek Trail from the airport into town must now be the safest road in all of the RMWB, if not Alberta. Hang in there and let's see what can be accomplished through our Council process to get that limit raised, it is ridiculously low, but we will have to wait for the report that Administration will come back with where they will have to justify the limit that has been set.

I do not know about you, but I am excited about the start of the sewer installation projects this year, and the continuation of the upgrade to our roads. This year's roads on the list for upgrading are Community and Weiss, as well as Sol Park. Next year Spruce Valley Drive and we'll have all new roads in Sapræ Creek (hope they do not lower the speed limit!?). Road work will continue on the Draper Road this year. Is it just me or have we been working on that road forever?

With respect to sewer installation, this year is just the Sapræ mains, it will be 2018 before you have your choice to hook up to the trunk line to have city-style sewer. Draper Road, your sewer project starts next year, can't do everything at once. The choice is the greatest feature: Want to stay with a field or tanks you pump out yourself? Can keep doing that for 25 years, your choice. I am kind of proud of the plan that we ended up with, everyone has freedom to choose for the next twenty five years if they want city-style sewer or not. Payment up front is \$10,000 in Sapræ, \$16,000 in Draper (you're getting sewer and water). Best deal ever. In Sapræ Creek, they will be upgrading the water lines as well, higher pressure and capacity, so lower house insurance rates for many. Funny, I've never hear anyone complaining about having the city-style water system in Sapræ Creek or longing to go back to wells or tanker delivery of water. I expect it will be the same in Draper once they get their sewer and water, they have paid a small fortune over the years for poor sewer and water service, can hardly wait for the projects to be done.

Watch for public engagement over the next couple months concerning what people would like to see on the empty land downtown. You can suggest anything you want; it is not just a yes or no about a theatre/arcade/bowling development. Given that the private sector has taken out development permits to build a bowling alley down off of Prairie Loop Blvd., and a theatre development has been announced for Eagle Ridge, with ten screens and lazy-boy seating, the field is open for what we could do with our municipal land. Personally, I do not think we should be competing with the private sector to build theatres and bowling alleys and such, municipalities should develop the things that the private sector cannot or will not: Parks/public spaces, arenas, recreational facilities, stuff like that. Council really would like to hear from people on this topic, keep an eye out for the public engagement schedule.





Rural Water & Sewer Servicing (RWSS) – March Update

The RWSS project aims to strengthen regional service delivery quality for the residents of Wood Buffalo. The project will see residents of Anzac, Conklin, Gregoire Lake Estates, Janvier Sapræe Creek and Draper receiving either new or upgraded water and sewer service. This update will help you stay informed about RWSS preparation in your community.

Gregoire Lake Estates

Beginning in late April or early May (based on weather conditions), ATCO Electric, ATCO Gas and Telus will be relocating utilities in the community of Gregoire Lake Estates. The expected timeline to completion is one month, barring any unforeseen complications. This work is required to clear a path for installation of sanitary and water mains by municipal contractors.

This work will involve realigning the currently existing power lines and replacing the utility poles with taller poles. As well as shifting the power lines, new gas mains will be installed on both sides of the road and temporary communication lines will be installed by Telus.

Following completion of franchise utility relocations, municipal contractors will move into the area and begin removing the road surface to install sanitary and water mains. A new ditch and culvert system will be put in place, as well. This work is expected to start in May or June 2016 (based on weather conditions). As the project is completed, residents will see their new main lines installed, but service connections will not be made at this time. Completion of the main lines and road rehabilitation is expected by the end of the 2017 construction season.

Anzac

Designs for the Anzac system have advanced farther than previously expected, allowing for an earlier start date and reducing the disruption to residents' lives caused by intense periods of construction. Work will begin on the Highway 881 and Stony Mountain lift stations in August 2016. These two installations are the first of seven new sanitary lift stations in Anzac.

Sapræe Creek


In May 2016, contractors will begin laying new sanitary mains and larger diameter water mains on Freestone Way and Sapræe Crescent. Contractors will also complete a final lift of the asphalt on Freestone Way and Sapræe Crescent. Completion of the initial section is expected by the end of the 2016 construction season, with final landscape cleanup in spring of 2017.

Following this initial round of construction, new sanitary mains and water mains will be constructed within the balance of Sapræe Creek Estates. The higher capacity water mains will provide full fire protection to the area.

Conklin

Tree clearing has been completed in preparation for new sanitary lines along Northland Drive, which will service the new Conklin Multiplex, as well as the Conklin Community School and the commercial properties on Northland Drive. Starting in May 2016, contractors will be laying new water and sanitary lines on Conklin Drive, Poplar Crescent, Spruce Drive, Poplar Drive and Pine Lane. This work will be completed as fast as possible in the 2016 construction season and all remaining work will be completed in the 2017 construction season. Before shutting down for the winter, all affected roads will be returned to a safe and drivable condition at the end of the 2016 construction season.

Two out of five new lift stations for Conklin will also be started, with full completion of all five stations expected by the end of the 2017 construction season.

Janvier

Work in Janvier will begin in the Summer of 2016 and will continue into 2017. A new lagoon is proposed in Janvier near the Solid Waste Transfer Station. Construction is pending approvals from regulatory authorities but is tentatively scheduled for January 2017. The lagoon will be in service by the end of 2017.

Draper

At this time, no construction is planned for 2016, but negotiation is ongoing to secure land for a new lift station to service this community and pave the way for future RWSS development.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo conducts hydrant flushing throughout the region starting in springtime through the fall each year.

2016 HYDRANT FLUSHING SCHEDULE

April	Abasand, Grayling Terrace, Beacon Hill & MacKenzie Industrial Park
May	Gregoire, Prairie Creek, Saprae Creek, Airport, Anzac, Janvier & Fort McKay
May or June	Downtown and Waterways
June or July	Thickwood
July	Fort Chipewyan
July or August	Dickinsfield
July through September	Timberlea, including Eagle Ridge, Stonecreek, Parsons Creek, & TaigaNova

WHY WE'RE DOING IT

Each spring the Municipality commences with its Preventative Maintenance program to ensure that the drinking water in the region is of the highest quality. The process also protects the Municipalities investment in its drinking water infrastructure and ensures that the hydrants are in good working condition for any emergency situation that may arise.

IMPACT TO RESIDENTS

Flushing is done from Monday through Friday from 7 am to 6 pm. During the flushing process your water will continue to be of high quality and your service will remain uninterrupted. You may however notice a fluctuation in pressure. If you happen to

notice some slight discoloration, run the cold tap for approximately 15 -20 minutes. If the discoloration continues call the Municipality.

IS FLUSHING A WASTEFUL PRACTICE?

No – Flushed water is discharged to the storm water system. It is dechlorinated to ensure there is no harmful impact to the environment.

WHOM DO I CALL IF I HAVE QUESTIONS?

If you have questions, please call the Pulse: Wood Buffalo Call Line at 780-743-7000. This line is staffed 24 hours a day, every day of the year.

WALKING SAFETY TIPS

Walk Facing Traffic: If there is no sidewalk and you must walk on the side of the road, choose the side where you are facing oncoming traffic. In North America, this is the left side of the road. This gives you the best chance to see traffic approaching closest to you and take evasive action when needed.

Cross Safely: Mom was right: look both ways before crossing any street. Make eye contact with any drivers who may be turning. Give them a wave. Make sure they see you.

Walk Single File: Unless you are on a sidewalk separated from the road or a wide bike lane, you should walk in single file. This is especially important on a road with lots of curves, where traffic has only a split second chance of seeing you before hitting you. While it can be enjoyable to walk down the road two to three abreast chatting merrily, drivers don't expect it and you may lose your best walking buddies.

Stay Aware of Bikes and Runners: Share the road and path with bikes and runners. Bike riders should alert you when approaching from behind with a bike bell or a "passing on the left/right." Listen for them, and move to walk single file, allowing them to pass safely. Runners should also call out for passing. Bike-walker collisions can result in broken bones or head injury for either — and you aren't wearing a helmet.

Be Visible: Wear bright colors when walking in daytime. When walking at night, wear light-colored clothing and reflective clothing or a reflective vest to be visible. Drivers are often not expecting walkers to be out after dark, and you need to give them every chance to see you, even at street crossings that have crossing signals. Be just as cautious at dawn or twilight, as drivers still have limited visibility or may even have the setting or rising sun directly in their eyes.

Hang Up and Eyes Up: Chatting or texting on a mobile device while you walk is as dangerous as doing those things while driving. You are distracted and not as aware of your environment. You are less likely to recognize traffic danger, passing joggers and bikers or tripping hazards. Potential criminals see you as a distracted easy target.

PREVENT WILDFIRES



In Alberta, recreational activities, such as backyard fire pits are often the cause of wildfires. Do your part in preventing wildfires by following the necessary precautions and obtaining a fire pit permit.

- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Completely extinguish your fires and remember to **SOAK IT, STIR IT and SOAK IT AGAIN.**
- Keep your fires small and be aware of sparks and strong winds.
- Burn only dry, well-seasoned wood, commercial fire logs or briquettes.
- Keep a fire extinguisher, hose or source of water nearby when using your fire pit.
- Ensure that wildfire hazards are low and that a fire ban has not been issued prior to using your backyard fire pit - www.albertafirebans.ca

Residents of Fort McMurray (Urban Service Area) are reminded that backyard fire pits require a permit. If you have recently installed a fire pit or are a new homeowner, you are required to submit a permit application to the Fire Prevention Branch, located at Fire Hall 5 (200 Airport Road, T9H 4P1).

Fire pit permit applications can be obtained by visiting www.rmwb.ca/fireprevention. There is a \$35 permit fee, and all approved permits are valid as long as the applicant resides at the address listed on the permit.

Residents living outside of the Urban Service Area can obtain a free fire permit from March 1 to October 31 through the local Environment and Sustainable Resource Development office by contacting 780.743.7125.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BE A VENDOR?

The Fort McMurray Urban Market is an Approved Alberta Farmers' Market and, as such, 80 percent of the product mix at the market must be made, baked, or grown within the province of Alberta.

WHAT ABOUT THE OTHER 20 PERCENT?

The Urban Market team has full discretion to determine the eligibility of the other 20 percent.

Priority will be given to:

WHAT PRODUCTS/VENDOR ARE NOT ELIGIBLE?

- Used or flea market products
- Chain or franchise establishments
- Networking marketing companies (online/catalog sale)

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS?

- Application package
- Business insurance (see below on how to get insurance)
- The necessary equipment
- Stall fee paid in full before start of the market

HOW MUCH IS THE STALL FEES?

10x10 stall fee is \$35 (thirty-five dollars) plus tax per stall, per market.
Truck stall fee is \$70 (seventy dollars) plus tax per stall, per market.

WHERE DO I GET INSURANCE?

- Speak to your insurance provider to see if your business is already covered for this type of event.
- The Alberta Farmers Market Association offers reasonable insurance rates to members.
- The Urban Market now offers vendors the option to purchase insurance on a per market basis for \$23.00 plus GST

WHAT EQUIPMENT DO I NEED?

- A 10' x 10' commercial grade tent
- Weights (25-50lbs per tent leg)
- Folding table(s)
- Chair(s)
- Signage with business name

CAN I RENT A TENT?

Yes, we have started to offer tent rentals at a rate of \$50 (fifty dollars) plus GST per market. They are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and limited to one per vendor per market.

DO I HAVE TO SIGN UP FOR ALL THE MARKETS?

No, vendors can sign up for any number of markets based on their availability; however, priority will be given to vendors that commit to the entire season.


