Councillor's Corner - April 2015 by Al Vinni

Hey, just want to say off the top what a blast Tammie and I had at the annual Saprae Creek tubing party. We teamed up with those crazy Hutton's to form the best high speed tube train ever, that went right into the bush off the end of the track. Thanks to our hosts at Vista Ridge led by Kevin, thanks to Bertini's catering for the great meal afterwards and thanks to everyone with the Residents Society for volunteering their time to again make this the best annual community activity we have. Awesome!

As I believe I mentioned last month, I was off to Burnaby for the Quarterly Board Meetings (QBM) of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM). I serve on FCM as part of my Council duties, and yes I get to travel to a different Canadian community every three months, but it is not all fun and games. We work a lot on policy and strategy for engaging with the Federal government to get them to do more for our municipalities, including the RM of Wood Buffalo. I am very excited to inform you that at the meetings in Burnaby it was announced that the September 2017 QBM will be held in Fort McMurray. This is 100 elected mayors and councillors, plus 30 or so FCM staff coming to Fort McMurray on their own dime, to experience what Fort McMurray and our region are actually all about. These are people that are positive about our country, and I think we will end up with more than a hundred very influential ambassadors that will describe and explain Fort McMurray to the people of their municipality. I have a standing bet that this will be the most well attended QBM in FCM history, and no one has bet against me yet.

Current economic times are pretty tough, more so for some than others. I, like many of you I'm sure, have struggled to find work at some time in your life; so for those who are looking for work now, I wish you all the best, and hope someone soon realizes how valuable you are.

From a Council perspective, the way I look at things is as follows. We certainly have to be prudent with the money we spend, to try and spend it where it will do the most good for the citizens of this region. However, that does not mean that we slash our budget to the point where we are laying off people and postponing much needed projects. I am very proud of the work our Council have done to this point to balance fiscal prudence with the recognition that we as a significant regional employer and investor need to step up to the plate and attempt to counteract the negative economic effects of the oil companies' efforts to cut their costs.

So, as a Council, we have stayed the course on our target employment levels, and will continue with a \$300 million dollar capital program as well as our \$500 million dollar operating budget. With the addition of \$200 million or more of spending on capital projects from previous years' budgets, we will inject over a billion dollars directly into the economy of the RM of Wood Buffalo this year, at a time when this spending is desperately needed to maintain employment and incomes for our citizens. It is in the good years to come that we should be reigning in spending, and we will have the chance to do so, as I believe in the long term viability of this region. For now, if we were to cut, cut, cut like the oil companies believe they must, we would only be making a bad situation worse, throwing more people out of work. This is the time when your municipality stands with you and your family by maintaining service levels and stimulating economic activity right here at home. This is the role of government, to step in when the private sector is in a trouble to stabilize a struggling economy. Quite frankly, we could use a few more Federal dollars like the \$25 million that the Feds are announcing for runway expansion at the airport tomorrow morning. Give the province their due; they have given us an unexpected \$12 million additional dollars under the Municipal Sustainability Initiatives program for this year. It was comforting for me to hear Municipal Affairs Minister McQueen say much the same thing that I have said above, that government has to step in when times are tough to keep development of needed infrastructure moving ahead, for the direct benefit of the residents of the municipality where the investment is occurring.

I am optimistic that as we soon move into the bright days of spring and summer, we will also see brighter days on the horizon for our economy. We will get our sewers and roads and new water lines over the next 2 years in our southern communities, and those projects will stand as a testament to our Council's determination to invest for the long term benefit of the people of this region.

FIRE PERMITS MARCH 1 - OCTOBER 31

Free fire permits now are available through your local Environment and Sustainable Resource Development office. Between March 1 and October 31 fire permits are required for all burning except campfires outside the Urban Service Area of Fort McMurray.

This includes:

- Fort Fitzgerald
- · Smith Landing
- Gregoire Lake Estates
- Fort Chipewyan
- Anzac
- · Saprae Creek
- · Fort Mackay
- East Draper Road
- First Nations Communities

Fire permits are still required year-round within the Urban Service Area of Fort McMurray through the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo.

PREVENT WILDFIRES



Do your part in preventing wildfires by following the necessary precautions and obtaining a fire pit permit.

- Never leave a fire unattended.
- Completely extinguish your fires and remember to SOAK IT, STIR IT, and SOAK IT AGAIN.
- Keep your fires small and be aware of sparks and strong winds.
- Burn only dry, well-seasoned wood, commercial fire logs or briquettes.
- Keep a fire extinguisher, hose or source of water nearby when using your fire pit.
- Ensure that wildfire hazards are low and that a fire ban has not been issued prior to using your backyard fire pit - www.albertafirebans.ca

Residents of Fort McMurray (Urban Service Area) are reminded that backyard fire pits require a permit. If you have recently installed a fire pit or are a new homeowner, you are required to submit a permit application to the Fire Prevention Branch, located at Fire Hall 5 (200 Airport Road, T9H 4P1).

Fire pit permit applications can be obtained by visiting www.woodbuffalo.ab.ca/fireprevention. There is a \$35 permit fee, and all approved permits are valid as long as the applicant resides at the address listed on the permit.

Residents living outside of the Urban Service Area can obtain a free fire permit from March 1 to October 31 through the local Environment and Sustainable Resource Development office by contacting 780.743.7125.
