

#### **RENEE'S REPORT**

#### WARD 3 COUNCILOR

First and foremost I would like to mention the recipients of this year's civic awards, congratulations and thank you to each and every one of you for your contributions to our community.

It has been an interesting start to the New Year at the council table. The first meeting January 12<sup>th</sup> saw Ms. Patricia (Trish) Paulichen (Draper) make a presentation to Council requesting that Draper be treated the same as all other rural communities, specifically in regards to water. The whole water issue in Draper has been a nick in my craw right from the start of being elected to council in 2004. In 2007, I finally managed to get a partial subsidy for the residents, that being they would receive a refund from the Municipality for their cost of water only down to \$1.00 from the commercial rates they were paying. I continued since that time, trying to get "equivalent" service to Draper as other rural communities, which is their delivery paid for. I had more or less given up when Trish came to me asking if she should present to council. Trish did a fabulous job representing her family and many others. However, I did get annoyed when a couple of councilors seemed to be unaware that the inequity existed. I thought that I had informed everyone, but I guess not. It ended well though, as administration has been requested to bring a report back to council. The motion was "Moved by Councilor Allen that the presentation made by Ms. Patricia Paulichen regarding water delivery costs be received as information and referred back to Administration to respond to Council questions regarding water delivery charges". I had been fighting for so long for this that I wanted a date for the report, which is why I voted against the motion. Council approved 1st reading on a new utility rate bylaw, the Regional Cemeteries document, appointments to council committees and the new Population and Employment projections which was a joint effort between administration the Oil Sands Secretariat and the Population and Employment Projection Model Advisory Committee. The population projections will be used by every department in the municipality to project new areas and the services that will be required, when and the budget that would be needed. Councilor Germain had submitted a notice of motion which after a lengthy decision was approved in part to create a subcommittee to develop a new structure of governance that allows the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo to develop a

clear and organized set of result-based governance policies, processes, and committee structures. This was followed by 4 new notices of motion to be dealt with at the January 26<sup>th</sup> meeting, one each from Councillors Vyboh, Germain, Byron and myself.

At the January 26<sup>th</sup> meeting of council, presentations were made by Mr. Sean Graham, Mr. Don Thompson and Mr. Dave Kirschner. Mr. Graham was asking council to create an Environment Committee to ask for community input on how the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo may become more environmentally friendly, which in my opinion we already have and have reports on it. Future Forward and Envision Wood Buffalo both have numerous ideas which council and administration are already implementing. Mr. Thompson presented on behalf of OSDG, thanking Mayor, council and administration for their continued efforts, discussions on the population model, budgets and committed to continue to work with administration on assessments. Mr. Kirschner and others presented on the "CILUS" (Commercial Industrial Land Use Study) which showed the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo being at a shortage of approximately 10% lands required for businesses to do business in the region. They encouraged council and administration to move faster on the release of lands. Administration and council are doing all we are able to pressure the Province to release lands for development. The "CILUS" report was approved as information and to be used as a guiding document on land release. Under bylaws was the Utility Rates for 2010, after many questions it was moved to return to the council agenda on February 9th meeting to have the questions answered. Under reports approved were accounts receivable bad debts and transfer of the assets of the Airport Commission to the newly created Airport Authority. Last but not least were the 4 notices of motion: 2 of which were defeated and the balance withdrawn. It was a long night, but much was accomplished.

February 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> will be our first review of the 2010 Capital budget, the 9th is the Saprae Creek Residents Society Annual General Meeting and on the 17<sup>th</sup> the official opening of the new and improved Vista Ridge.. In other words February should be another interesting and eventful month.





The McMurray Sno-Drifters is a non profit Society that provides safe and educational winter recreation for individuals and families within the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. We provide education about snowmobiling that includes information about existing by-laws, safe sledding practices, maps of the trail systems and trail safety. Through our efforts the public enjoys sledding on well maintained and groomed trails that are signed for safety and are very user friendly. These efforts promote and increase the usage of the trails while also protecting the environment as users stay on the trails and do not ride on undisturbed natural habitats, private property or forested areas. We have also placed and maintained several warm-up areas along the trail where users can take a break to roast some hot dogs and sip on hot chocolate. We are also affiliated with the Alberta Snow Mobile Association (ASA) and promote and attend snow mobile rallies that are held at different locations all throughout Alberta. These events draw hundreds of sledding participants that definitely benefits Alberta's winter tourism industry and hospitality industries.

We are currently in the planning stages to connect our existing Anzac Trail to the Stoney Mountain Trail which is south west of Anzac. We are in the process of utilizing a land agent to assist us in achieving all of the necessary requirements as set forth by Sustainable Resource Developments (SRD) and to get all of the approvals required for this connecting trail. Once this is achieved, we will have over 250 kilometers of groomed trails for the safe riding enjoyments for all residents of the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo and surrounding areas. This trail will be unsurpassed as it will be one of the longest groomed trail systems in Alberta. We are hoping to accomplish this goal by Spring of 2011.

We truly appreciated your assistance with this fund raising endeavor by you providing our Association with a donation that can be used for a silent auction that will be held on March 6, 2010 at the Sawridge Hotel. Our membership has grown steadily to over 300 current members and is continuing to climb in addition to approximately 10, 000 users of our current trail systems.
