Councillor's Corner – January 2014 by Al Vinni



As another New Year begins, I go back to the drawing board to make a few resolutions. Eat right and exercise; those are the two main ones my doctors are always telling me to concentrate on. I will try again, but I'm not optimistic, it is proving hard to train an old dog. However, I wish you success with your resolutions, but better yet, I hope that the plans and aspirations that you have for this New Year and the years to come all come to fruition.

My plans at this time as Councillor for Ward 3 are as follows: Number one, get road paving done. The money for the paving is in the budget, just waiting for that budget to pass, maybe sometime in January if we're lucky. Work in Sapræ Creek will start with Spruce Valley Drive and in Draper, the road building underway will continue. In three years I believe we can expect to see all roads throughout the Ward in a condition that we will be very pleased with.

Number two, get community halls in both Draper and Sapræ Creek built. While much still has to be done to get these projects completed, I assure you that there continues to be a lot of support for these projects in municipal administration and around the Council table. As I was reminded by a constituent some time ago, consultation with community members is critical to getting everything right with the plans for these two halls. Of course that is the key part of this process as the halls are going to be built because of the desire by the residents of Ward 3 for these amenities. It only stands to reason that the residents will be consulted; in fact, without the strong support of the residents for these projects, they might not happen. These are grass roots projects that require community involvement. I assure you that I have heard from many of you that there is commitment to proceeding to getting these halls built.

Number three, proceed to finish the Placemaking and park development projects that have been started. I agree with those that have pointed out that Draper needs more in this regard, and I agree. And yes, if it were up to me you could have a couple of those banners we have out at the highway in Sapræ Creek, six does seem like a lot. Draper Road will get some Placemaking amenities as well.

Number four is continuing to work on a plan for proper drainage in Sapræ Creek. Improper drainage is a problem for a number of residents, and I will continue to work on trying to get a resolution to this issue. It is not easy, given the history of the Sapræ Creek development, initially as part of Improvement District 18. Again, municipal administration is committed to finding a fix to this problem; they need our encouragement, involvement and support to get it done.

Please let me know what the other priorities are that you see for Ward 3. I know there are others, I have just highlighted some of the main ones above, but there are a lot of other issues that need to be addressed. 

STAY SAFE WHILE STAYING WARM!



Fort McMurray winters bring bitter cold temperatures. Stay safe while using portable heaters, furnaces and fireplaces by following safety precautions to ensure that your home is not heated because of a fire!

PORTABLE SPACE HEATERS

- When purchasing a portable heater ensure that it has been certified by a recognized regulatory body, such as the Canadian Standards Association (CSA).
- Space heaters should be placed on a level, hard and non-combustible surface (avoid carpets or rugs).
- Ensure the space heater is placed 1 metre from any combustible objects, such as curtains, bedding or blankets.
- Do not leave children or pets unattended around a space heater.
- Always turn off space heaters before leaving the room or going to bed.

Tips:

- Ensure your space heater is equipped with an automatic cut-off device. This will shut off the heater if tipped over.
- Fuel burning space heaters (kerosene or gas) should be inspected annually. Ensure you are using the proper grade of fuel source for your unit and that it is cleaned regularly.

FURNACES

- Furnaces should be inspected by a qualified and registered contractor at least once a year.
- Keep the area around your furnace clear.
- Each month, inspect your furnace for the following:
 - › Filters — Change and/or clean according to manufacturer's instructions.
 - › Vents—Look for any signs of rust, blockages or soot. If found, consult with a qualified technician.
 - › The flame should be sharp and blue. If the flame is yellow, consult with a qualified technician.

FIREPLACES

- Inspect and clean your fireplaces, vents and chimneys regularly.
- Check for rust or creosote: a dark substance that forms in the flue. If a buildup of creosote is made, it can catch fire.
- Observe any excessive heat on the walls above your fireplace. This could be a sign of improper chimney installation, and a potential fire hazard.
- Keep combustible objects away from your wood stove or fireplace and always use a properly fitted screen to cover the fireplace opening. Floors and walls should be protected with noncombustible shields.
- Keep a heat-tempered glass or metal fireplace screen in place.
- Dispose of fireplace ashes in a closed metal can and store outside.
- Burn only dry, seasoned wood and never use combustible liquid to start the fire.
- Chimneys and vents need to be cleaned and inspected by a qualified professional at least once a year.




