# RENÉE'S REPORT

#### WARD 3 COUNCILOR

Well I don't know about El Nino...doesn't seem like it so far, but you never know. I realized after sending my newsletter report last month that I forgot to wish everyone a safe and wonderful holiday season, so here it is now, a little late. I hope everyone had a joyous and safe Christmas and New Years. May 2010 be a wonderful year for each and everyone you hold dear.

The December 8th meeting of council saw 2nd and 3rd readings, including many amendments, for the "single use shopping bag ban". After much debate and numerous amendments, the "bag ban" (as it's been dubbed) was approved for implementation September 1, 2010. Administration along with our "recycling" partners will also move forward with education and awareness programs until then. The "bag ban" will be enforced on a complaint basis only. Approved were the "policies and principals" for where, what and how the Municipality will house the staff required to provide services to the region, the document is called the "Accommodations Master Plan". Council also approved transferring \$12,243,523.00 of excess funds from the 2008 emerging issues to the 2009 emerging issues in order to balance the 2009 budget, an approval to transfer from the emerging issues to cover any possible deficit. The night was filled with money issues as Mayor and Council also approved the 2010 operating budget in the amount of \$495,341,653.00. After 3 days of discussions in October, an additional 3 updates and reviews, I could support with no questions the presented budget. The presented budget will see little increase in spending over last year's budget, but will continue to provide the same services, with enhanced street cleaning and an additional "Environmental Services" department. Administration did an amazing job and worked extremely hard to bring forward exactly what I was hoping to see, including an annual budget amount of \$5,000.00 for the Draper Road Residents' Society and will come forward later with a potential plan for

partial transit to Saprae.

In February, the SCRS Recreation and Culture Grant recipients were announced: Gabrielle Alcock, Pierce Mimura and Brooke Voigt. Valentine's Day was celebrated at Cupid's Freaky Friday dance party on February 13th at the Fire Hall. The Saprae Creek Residents Society held it's Annual General Meeting on February 19th. Vista Ridge unveiled its expansion plans at an open house on February 4th. Free cross-country ski lessons were held for locals at the playing field.

In March 2009 the Ward 3 News had a St. Pat's word scramble challenge. The winners were Michelle Bechtel and Nicolas Davies.

In April to recognize Earth Day, the SCRS hosted The Amazing Recycling Round-Up at the recycling Depot on Freestone Way East. Ward 3 News had an Easter coloring contest with many winners: Danica Hutton, Jessie Lauzon, Jasmine Lauzon, Damara Hutton, Elaine Vancoughnett, Allie Spencer, Danielle Vancoughnett, Ledeen Bechtel, Kansas

In May the eco-friendly residents of Saprae Creek pitched in at the May 9th Community Clean-Up and recycled their unwanted and extra stuff at the May 23rd Community-Wide Garage Sale.



In June a public hearing was held on June 23rd in Council Chambers regarding the proposed home business change allowing the storage and maintenance of up to 3 vehicles over 7000kg GVW. Many residents spoke both for and against the proposed changes. The end result of the proposed change was unanimously denied by council.





The summer months in Saprae Creek saw a visit from the Community in Blooms judges on July 22nd. August 9th and 10th was the SCRS Casino: thank you volunteers! The Public Library came out for its first monthly visit to the Saprae Creek Fire Hall on August 17th. The RMWB bike club came out and did a guided ride with the Saprae Creek youth on August 22nd.

September was Back to School. The Ward 3 News had a Back 2 School challenge. The winners were Joshua Paulichen, Josephine Paulichen, Ledeen Bechtel and Ronan Reddy. Another highlight of September was the completion of the Skateboard Park located at Vista Ridge.

October was a busy month for the Saprae Creek Fire Hall as firefighters honed their skills and techniques through intensive vehicle rescue training. October also saw the completion of the new playground.



In November recipients of the SCRS Recreation and Culture Grant were announced: Graeme Killick, Pierce Mimura and Brooke Voigt.

December saw the grand re-opening of Vista Ridge in mid-December. On December 16th, Ivanhoe Energy held an open house to inform residents of the proposed construction of an all weather access road with bridge across the Clearwater River. The proposed access road starts from Spruce Valley Drive, approximately 1 km from Highway 69 and crosses the river east of the Saprae Creek community near the existing pipeline corridor. (see map page 7). On December 18th, the SCRS hosted a Frosty Family Fiesta at Vista Ridge. Santa arrived in a helicopter and greeted the 160 residents who attended the event. On December 31st, the SCRS and Vista Ridge rung in the New Year together with dual parties—one for the kids and one for the adults. There were party hats, food, games, prizes and an amazing fireworks show. It was a fun end to 2009!


