# Renée's Report

Summer is upon us and it's way too short so let's all get out and enjoy it safely. I have been receiving a few complaints on the number of quads and dirt bikes racing up and down the roads. Parents please remind your children of the rules pertaining to off highway vehicles; we do not want to lose the privilege of riding our machines out here.

FCM in Quebec was a wonderful opportunity to meet and talk with other councilors across the country. Mayor Blake had an enormous impact on everyone in attendance at one of the many forums, she spoke on infrastructure. The FCM has devised a new tool for Municipalities to use, to show how growth and projects in each community will help the balance of the province and the federal government, by way of jobs and taxes. The forum presenters spoke, and with the tool, showed how much the province and feds benefit from municipal projects. Whereas, when Mayor Blake spoke on the Waste Water Treatment plant, the audience could not believe how little the province and feds are doing to assist this region. This is not news to those of us who live here, but I believe it was an eye opener for the balance of Canada.

The brand new Saprae Creek Recycling Centre is now open! I was glad and honored to on behalf of Mayor and Council to cut the official ribbon at the new centre on June 9th. I hope that the Saprae centre will be the biggest producer of recycled materials per person in this municipality!

At the June 10th meeting of council; approved were the operating principals and protocols for all the Part IV corporations, monies for MacDonald Island, the Fort McMurray "Squirts" Softball Association to hold Provincials here on July 4th to 6th. If you are in town head up to Timberlea Athletic Park and cheer on the home team as they play fast pitch. Also, approved was additional money to complete the warehouse for the RCMP/Search and Rescue.

The June 24th meeting of council, Mayor Blake did the official swearing in ceremonies for Councilor Elect Sonny Flett who won back his seat in the June 9th by-election for Ward 2: Fort Chipewyan/Fort McKay. Mayor and council heard delegations by a group calling themselves the Fort McMurray Ice Users Group and Ross Green, representing the Part IV board of MacDonald Island. They were asking council to not close down MacDonald Island for the winter. This was never administration's intention. The old ice rink and curling ice will need to be brought up to current code for fire and safety and may have to be closed for the upgrades. Administration continues to look at alternatives to do the upgrades as quickly as possible and does have a plan to adjust ice times to enable everyone as much ice time as possible, including the utilization of the new outdoor rink on Signal Road. The rink will be outfitted with warm up facilities and a zamboni, this will be a great alternative should the ice rink be closed all winter. Also, approved was a land use amendment for Anzac to allow as discretionary use housing over ground floor commercial, money needed for the I

immediate repair of Draper Road and the Mackenzie pump house and reservoir.

I have been receiving complaints about the noise coming from the gravel crusher operating near the airport. I have asked administration to investigate the operating times allowed as per the permit and hope to have an answer shortly. If it is also keeping you awake at night, please call By-Law at 780-799-8850 to register your complaint.



Thank you to all of you who participated as well as those who have taken it upon themselves to clean up a portion of the road on your own time. We will be having another community clean-up in the coming weeks to finish the rest of the road. I've spoken with Al of the Sno-Drifters who will be cleaning up the quad/snowmobile trail; the trail is quite littered as it nears Waterways. Al shares many of our issues regarding the trail and I look forward to his future involvement with our group.

I am quite pleased to announce that the June 24th Council meeting saw more commitment to our community from the municipality than any other time in recent history. It was recently noted by the

CAO of the roads department that Draper Road itself has failed. This report on the 24th was a recommendation as to what to do in the immediate future to repair the road until the final realignment and reconstruction is complete. Local resident, Tom Weber, made a presentation detailing the condition of the road. Several municipal councilors (including Councilor Rebus) also made extensive comments on the state of the road and other recommendations were brought forth. One recommendation was for the municipality to give the Draper area \$594, 000 for immediate repairs, however it was instead doubled to \$1.2 million. It was suggested that this money should be used to improve a 300 metre section at the beginning of the road, past the first "S" bend. and the vote was passed. Some brush on either side of the road will also be cleared for better visibility. Although it is only temporary, this is a step in the right direction. Please continue to phone in any concerns regarding the road to 743-7859.

It was also mentioned that the forthcoming King Street pump station will include provisions for a Draper area water line -- YEAH! While there is not much information currently available for the expansion project, I will be sure to keep our community informed as details become available. Several residents have been contacting me regarding dogs in the area. If you are a dog owner, please ensure it stays on your property! One resident was recently chased by 6 dogs and another resident was almost bit by a dog; both of these residents were simply talking a walk on our road and were not at all threatening anyone's property. Also, during our community clean-up there were 9

dogs following our cleaners! This is not acceptable, nor responsible, pet ownership and those who have phoned in their concerns to the society have been encouraged to contact the pound (743-8997) when issues like this arise.

There are several sections to the RMWB animal control bylaw, located at <a href="http://www.woodbuffalo.ab.ca/residents/bylawservices/pdf/Animal%20Control%20Bylaw.pdf">http://www.woodbuffalo.ab.ca/residents/bylawservices/pdf/Animal%20Control%20Bylaw.pdf</a> that I would like to highlight:

• All dogs in the municipality are required to be licensed and wear appropriate tags (Section 3.01, 3.02 and 3.06)



• No more than 2 outdoor dogs per property (outside 12+ hours per day) are permitted within the municipality (Section 3.15)

- Dogs are not permitted to run loose off of the owner's property on to roads or any one else's property (Section 4.01)
- Dogs are not permitted to chase any vehicle (Section 4.05c)

It's also good to know that, if you are having difficulty keeping your dog(s) on your property,

you can purchase a radio collar/wireless fence system from Canadian Tire, Northstar Pets, and the like. We have one for our dog and it works great. She stays within 90 feet around the house and cannot wander on to the road to chase vehicles or harass any of our neighbours. The dog catchers have been patrolling our area, so please be sure to keep your animals on your property to avoid them being hauled away (and also to avoid neighbours being mad at you!).


