Free Rapid Test Kits

The Government of Alberta is providing Albertans with free COVID-19 rapid antigen testing kits for at-home use. Kits can be picked up at <u>select locations</u> on a first-come first-served basis, while supplies last. Additional locations will be added as more kits are available. Vaccine Program

The Government of Alberta's Vaccine Program continues to be well underway.

Everyone 5+ can now get vaccinated. Children 5 to 11 must book online or by calling 811, walk-ins are not available at this time. Third doses will be rolled out to all Albertans 18+ in stages.

Saprae Contract 1 - RWSS

The project has achieved construction completion. No further work will take place in the winter but minor seasonal touch ups will be completed in the spring and summer of 2022.













L Robert Industrial Park Lift Station, Forcemain and A Frame Road Upgrades

Gravel Road is complete. For the Lift Station, secant shoring is 100% complete and for the force main, a third of the pipe is laid. Next steps include continuing foundation work on the lift station and laying sanitary force main. Estimated completion date is June 30, 2023.







A message from Emergency Management: Extreme cold

In Alberta, an extreme cold warning is issued when temperatures or the wind chill index reach minus 40°C or colder. Being exposed even for short periods in these conditions can be dangerous.

Protect yourself and your loved ones

- Stay safe, warm and protected.
- Stay indoors when possible. If you have to travel by car, know your route ahead of time and make sure you have a well-stocked emergency kit in your vehicle.
- Dress in warm, windproof layers. Watch for signs of frostbite. Frostbite can occur in less than 10 minutes in extreme cold.
- When working outside, do not over exert yourself. Sweating can lead to hypothermia, which can be fatal.
- Make sure your pets have warm shelter during a cold snap.

Driveway snow removal reminder

Bylaw Services would like to remind residents to remove snow or ice on sidewalks adjacent to their property within 48 hours after a snowfall and that the snow should not be placed on a Highway, Public Place or private property that is not their own.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES & EVENTS



If you are a vulnerable person living in the region, you may be at greater risk during an emergency. Stay prepared by joining the Vulnerable Persons Registry (VPR).

What is the VPR?

The VPR is a free, voluntary and confidential service that improves the safety of vulnerable residents living at home. This is done by communicating directly with registrants during emergencies and by sharing key information to local first responders.

Who is eligible?

The VPR is available to residents in the region who experience any of the following:

- Mobility issues
- Visual or hearing impairments
- · Developmental or cognitive impairments
- · Challenges related to mental health
- Individuals who require electricity for life-sustaining equipment (life support, oxygen or dialysis)

Individuals registering for the Vulnerable Persons Registry must have a permanent address and at least one (1) valid contact number on their application. Individuals who are unable to meet these criteria will not be eligible for the registry.
