Rural Water & Sewer Servicing (RWSS) Saprae Creek Estates Update

NEXT STEPS: LOT BY LOT ASSESSMENT

Thank-you to all residents who participated in the lot by lot assessments. The information gathered will be compiled and presented to Council in the fall. The lot by lot assessment process will help support the proposed on-site service connection plan that was presented on November 27, 2018. This plan includes how and when residents will be able to pay their service connection fee.

Once the plan is approved, it will be drafted into a by-law for Council's approval. This means that the by-law must be read three times in a public meeting for Council's consideration. The aim of the proposed on-site service connection plan is to finalize service connection fees and all other aspects on the programs. For further information please visit: www.rmwb.ca/rwss

H. Wilson is continuing underground and road construction in Saprae Creek Estates. Crews are working diligently to have all residence off temporary water and on to permanent water lines.

The underground crews are performing testing on Freestone Way and Saprae Crescent and are currently installing underground infrastructure on Saprae Crescent.

Road repair will continue on Freestone Way working their way down to Saprae Crescent. Weiss Drive is not paved from Spruce Valley Dr. to Janke Lane. Community Lane (East of Spruce Valley Drive) has had the first layer of paving completed.

Community Lane ditch grading and landscaping is ongoing. Culvert drainage on Sommer Way, Conifer Way, Evergreen Place, Volley Gate, Freestone Way, and Saprae Crescent will be restored by the end of the construction season.

Weaver Group Ltd. Crews have completed work for this year. Additional work along Saprae Creek Trail affecting A-Frame road will occur in early 2020.



In October, Chandos will begin work on a new sewage lift station at the Saprae Creek Estates Firehall property. We anticipate minimal disruption to residents, consisting of temporary traffic diversions and one-lane closures as needed to complete intermittent equipment and material deliveries

During construction, we are working in close cooperation with emergency services to ensure our safety is cared for. We thank you for your patience and consideration while we continue to make improvements to the Saprae Creek Estates community.



Travelling to Fort McMurray this winter?

Watch out for on-street parking restrictions!

Winter Maintenance Zones will be active October 15 to April 15, pending weather conditions. During this time there may be residential on-street parking restrictions in effect in Fort McMurray on weekdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Make sure to follow posted signage and electronic signage in the neighbourhood you park your vehicle.

Help us clear a path through winter and plan ahead for on-street parking restrictions at rmwb.ca/snowplow.

How do Winter Maintenance Zones work?

Every neighbourhood has been divided into five Winter Maintenance Zones, one for each weekday. Each Winter Maintenance Zone is further broken down into four subzones 1, 2, 3 and 4. On the day that each Zone is active, some of the Subzones within the larger active Zone will be serviced and others will be relaxed. Residents will be able to park in relaxed Subzones without being ticketed or towed. Relaxed Subzones will be communicated on neighbourhood electronic signage, social media and rmwb.ca.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo has scheduled a Public Hearing to take place on Tuesday, October 22, 2019 at 4:00 p.m. in the Jubilee Centre Council Chamber, Fort McMurray, regarding the following:

- Bylaw No. 19/023 Fees Amending Bylaw
- Bylaw No. 19/024 Fees, Rates and Charges Bylaw

A comprehensive cost analysis was completed for all user fees and charges that the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo levies for goods, services and access to facilities. Based on this analysis, several user fees and charges are recommended to be adjusted and implemented in 2020. Bylaw No. 19/023 proposes to amend the user fees and charges set out in a number of bylaws, including Land Use Bylaw No. 99/059. Bylaw No. 19/024 proposes to incorporate the fees charged by the Municipality for various services, licenses, permits and approvals to be incorporated into a single Fees, Rates and Charges Bylaw. All user fees and charges that the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo levies for goods, services and access to facilities, were analyzed and are recommended to be adjusted and implemented in 2020.

A copy of the above-noted Bylaw and all related documents may be inspected by contacting the Finance Department (3rd Floor, Jubilee Centre, Fort McMurray); or Legislative Services (7th Floor, Jubilee Centre, Fort McMurray), between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday. Bylaw Nos. 19/023 and 19/024 are also available on the Municipality's website at www.rmwb.ca/hearings.

If you would like to appear before Council:

- You must forward a request to the Chief Legislative Officer, clearly stating your support or opposition of the Bylaw, along with any related information, by:
 - Registering on-line at www.rmwb.ca/publichearingsubmission;
 - Emailing Legislative.Assistants@rmwb.ca; or
 - Calling Legislative Services at 780-743-7001.
- Ensure that your correspondence includes your address, and a telephone number or e-mail address at which
 you may be contacted.
- All submissions must be received by the Chief Legislative Officer by 12:00 noon, Wednesday, October 16, 2019.
- Council may choose to hear from persons who may not have made a written submission prior to the Council hearing. Subject to Council's consent to speak at the hearing, anyone who wishes to also distribute written material at the time of their presentation should bring 15 copies of their material for distribution.

Please note any information you submit to Council for their consideration at Public Hearings is added in its entirety to the agenda, which is made available to the public and posted on the Municipality's website.
