Councillor Report

Saprae September

It's amazing how fast our summer has gone this year. I want to thank everyone for their continued patience with the construction that has been going on. I know it's frustrating to have so much going on at once but that said: Only 60 more construction days for this year!

That said, I do have an update as of today (August 27): the directional drilling will be done by the end of September, and they will be installing the service pipes until the end of November. Paving will continue until the end of October

Freestone Way- directional drilling has started so there are sections where the traffic will be one lane only.

East Community Lane has their new culverts installed, the pressure testing of the water line is done and passed, gravel will be put on the road and the first layer of paving will be started soon. Impact should be one lane traffic flow.

West Community Lane will be having the pressure test soon. Then it will be culverts, gravel and paving. The impact will be a little more than the east side by it should be minimal.

Weiss Drive is next to be done. The directional drilling is almost complete and then the services to be installed.

Spruce Valley Drive is coming along nicely. The lights are set so that the average time waiting at the red is about 6 minutes if it has just turned when you get there. The next section of spruce Valley will be between Weiss and Community and there will be detours in place.

School will be starting soon and I just want to remind parents to remind their young people to be aware of the construction areas and to make sure they stay away from the equipment, etc. Also for our drivers to obey the traffic signs, and flag people and to not pass the school bus when the flashing red lights are active. The plan is to have all of Saprae Creek with the first coat of paving done before the snow flies.

Finally, that I you again for your continued patience and to remember that by October 2019, this will be completely done and we can look forward to paved roads, fire hydrants and best of all, lower insurance rates for our homes.

GRIEF: A Misunderstood and Neglected Emotion

Grief is one of the most misunderstood emotions, the assumption being that it is only connected with death. Grief is:

- A normal and natural reaction to a significant emotional loss of any kind.
- Conflicted feelings caused by the end of or a change in familiar patterns of behaviour.
- The feeling of reaching out for someone who has always been there only to find when you need them again, they are no longer there.
- Not a pathological condition.

How to Tell When Grief is Incomplete

- If you are unwilling to think about or talk about someone who has died or any other loss that may signify unresolved grief.
- If fun memories become painful, you may be experiencing unresolved grief.
- If you want to talk only about positive aspects of a relationship, there might be unresolved grief.
- Wanting to only talk about negative aspects of a relationship may be a sign of unresolved grief.
- Unresolved grief may be at the root of any fear associated with thoughts or feelings about a relationship.

Processing Incomplete Grief

- Acceptance and awareness
- Have a different relationship with your Short Term Energy Relieving Behaviours (STERBs)
- Talk with safe people


Did you know there are simple steps you can take at home to help reduce the risk of wildfire damage to your house, your property and your community?

These simple steps include: Removing leaves, pine needles and other debris from your roof and gutters Mowing grass to 10 centimeters in length or less Maintaining a 1.5 metre non-combustible zone around your home and deck Moving all combustible items stored under your deck. The area under your deck should be clean and free of debris Moving propane tanks 10 metres away from structures and creating a 1.5 metre non-combustible zone around all tanks Clearing vegetation and debris along both sides of combustible fence lines

Taking small actions today can go a long way in protecting you from the threat of future wildfires on our landscape.




Rural non-residential small businesses can now apply to receive new tax savings. Qualifying rural non-residential small businesses can receive a 25 per cent reduction from the rural non-residential tax rate. To qualify, properties must meet criteria outlined in provincial regulation, specifically:

- Currently taxed as rural non-residential;
- Property must be owned or leased by a business (properties subleased are excluded);
- Business must hold an RMWB Business Licence as of December 31, 2017*;
- Business must have fewer than 50 employees across Canada; and
- Business must not be a designated industrial property as identified by the Provincial Assessor.

^{*}If your business is located within the rural service area and provincial legislation does not require you to hold an RMWB business licence, please contact Philip Schofield, Regional Assessor, at philip.schofield@rmwb.ca.
